
Free Swim - Is offered to all campers each day. A modest, one piece swimsuit is recommended.

CRAFT CHOICES

The number in parenthesis tells the grade the camper must be going into to take this craft. If there is not a grade listed, the craft is open to all. Some craft sizes are limited.

- Marchery: (4th grade & up) Instruction in bow & arrow.
- 30 Archery: (7th & 8th grade) Learning to hunt with realistic targets in our woods. Prior experience in archery is required.
- Basketball: Learn the skills of basketball through drills and scrimmaging.
- BB Guns (Air Riflery): (4th grade & up) Lessons in safety, equipment and the techniques of using a BB gun.
- 5th Beadie Buddies: Crafts with beads.
- Bottle Rocket: Assemble and launch rockets made from 2-liter bottles to see how high they can go.
- *Canoeing: (5th grade & up) (14 per hour)
- <u>Card Making</u>: Learn the art of making your own greeting cards. Learn to use brads, eyelets, stamps and embossing tools.
- Carpentry: (6th grade & up) (8 per hour) Introduction to woodshop safety, use of small hand tools to make wooden projects.
- 10th Ceramics: Painting ceramic pieces.

- **1th Cheerleading:** (15 per hour)
- <u>Crochet Critters</u>: (4th grade & up) (12 per hour) Learn how to crochet the very popular critters.
- Advanced Cooking: (7th & 8th grade) Learn advanced cooking skills.
- Cooking: (5th & 6th grade) (15 per hour) Basics of cooking.
- Explorers: Have fun exploring the nature around our area.
 Old tennis shoes are required you will get them wet and muddy.
- **16th** *<u>Fishing</u>: (13 per hour)
- Fitness Fun: Learn different workouts like; mobility / strengthening / Pilates / Zumba / Kickboxing / etc.
- 18th <u>Grilling:</u> (6th grade & up) Instruction to grilling using a variety of foods.
- 19th Handcrafts: (2nd-4th grades) (20 per hour)
- Invisible Power: (4th grade & up) (15 per hour)
 Having fun doing experiments with the invisible power we get from electricity. The instructor is a Master Electrician.
- **20st Jewelry:** (5th grade & up) Making bold fashion jewelry.
- <u>Leather Craft:</u> Beginner & Intermediate. Tooling, lacing and crafts such as coin purses, key chains and ID tags.

- MTB Trail Building: (4th grade & up) Plan, build and ride new mountain trail segments in the woods around camp. Shovels provided. Bring a bike.
- Outdoor Life: Learn special tricks of the trade for camping and cooking in the woods.
- Advanced Outdoor Life: (Passing Outdoor Life is a prerequisite) Learn knot tying, making furniture out of wood, and cooking over a fire.
- **Painting:** (4th grade & up) (7 per hour) Learn the basics of painting with acrylic paints.
- Pinterest Party: (5th grade & up) (15 per hour) Projects inspired by popular pins from an online search engine.
- <u>Riflery</u>: (7th & 8th grade) NRA Instruction using .22 rifles.
- Scrap Booking: (6th grade & up)
- <u>Sewing</u>: (4th grade & up) (10 per hour) Learn the skill of sewing. From threading a needle / hand sewing / machine sewing.
- Swimming: Basic swim instruction. A modest one-piece suit is recommended.
- 2nd <u>Ultimate Survival</u>: (6th grade & up) Outdoor survival skills. Tennis shoes required.
- Wood Carving: Beginner & Advanced. (6th grade & up) Carving walking sticks and more using a dremel tool, sandpaper and stain.
